This has been a significant project over the last 18 months and the new system allows us considerably more flexibility and improved reporting capability.

As part of this considerable investment of time and money in the new LIMS, we have rolled out new and improved reporting templates for all test groups. These reports are different from what clients are used to seeing, and there are a few tips to get the most from these reports – see inside.

AgVita has also had a few staff changes over the preceding few months in some key business areas – please read more below to hear what has changed at the Lab.

There will be no rest for our team as we will remain open and operating at full capacity right through the Christmas-New Year period. The only days the Lab will be closed are gazette public holidays and Friday January 2nd 2015.

Another exciting announcement from the Lab has been our investment in new analytical equipment – we have significantly increased capacity and improved quality for all tests with several recent key purchases.

AgVita launches new LIMS Database:


AgVita is excited to announce that we have successfully commissioned our new and improved LIMS. This change has been prompted by the strain on our existing system and desire to allow more flexibility for all analytical tests. While clients won't see much change apart from the new reports (see below) the improvements behind the scenes at AgVita have allowed us to improve scheduling, modify existing test components and compile cross-product information.

AgVita's new reporting templates

As well as our new database, we have radically improved the type of reports we now issue to all clients. These new reports deliver analytical results loaded in to current report master templates, which is a big improvement from our previous system of reporting just raw data that needed to be loaded manually into client-managed templates. For NUtest, this means that the reporting template has the <u>latest</u> crop specific desirable levels every time. If any reviews of desirable levels are made to NU-test data, or improvements to the design of the reporting template implemented, these changes are immediately updated and any reports sent from that day carry the updates.

These new reports are quite different from our old system, and there have been several questions asked of us by clients unfamiliar with these new reports. To aid in the



implementation of these new reports, we have released some instructions (available on our website, and linked here). This document has several FAQ's and detailed instructions to help those unfamiliar with the new format.

iPads are causing some angst for users as our reports are often not fully compatible. We suggest running the Excel App (free, see link here) and anecdotally have heard that Office 365 is also preferred for full functionality. At this stage, the new reports are not compatible with iPhones, they can be viewed but with no scope to select between paddocks – an app will be developed at a later stage.

As always, the friendly AgVita staff are available to answer any questions you may have regarding these new reports.

This considerable expenditure has given us both increased capacity and increased redundancy for existing machines. We have also invested in an ultra-pure water purification system to further improve the quality of analyses.
